Parent Information Sheet

Year 3 "Who lives in a cave like this?"

We will journey back in time to the time of the Stone Age. As we travel into the past we will learn about what life was like for our pre-historic ancestors, from hunting and cave painting to clothing and homes. We will follow our ancestors into the Bronze Age and travel with them to the Iron Age.

Aspiration:

Children will look at the resilience of the stone age man and apply this skill to their own learning.

Creativity:

We will be focusing on 3D modelling to create our own shelters for the stone age man.

Resilience:

Children will work in pairs and groups to explore the varying emotions of a character in a story. They will have the opportunity to use this in creative writing and evaluate and improve writing with peers.



Topic Challenge Home Learning

Research the stone age to discover and understand what life was like and how it compares to today's world.

To create a cave painting to tell a story of an aspect of life in the Stone Age e.g. hunting, gathering.

As Historians:

We will learn about what life was like for people in the past. Using our imagination to think about what the world was like. Imagining what we would have seen, heard smelt, tasted as Stone Aged people.

As Artists:

Children will use a wide range of art and construction materials to create art work linked to the Stone Age.

As Scientists:

We will take part in an archaeological dig to unearth the remains of ancient objects. Our science topic will be about the classification of rocks permeability and hardeness.
