Topic Challenge Home Learning

This half term is all about traditional tales, as we share and enjoy folk stories from around the world. You can help your child's learning at home by sharing your own favourite traditional rhymes and tales and sharing stories and memories with your child from your own family history.

You could also:

- Visit the local library to see what traditional tales and stories you can find.
- Using items from around your house, can you build a castle for Rapunzel? A bridge for the Billy Goats Gruff? A shelter for Chicken Licken?
- Cook your own porridge, gingerbread people biscuits or even a sweet house like the one in Hansel and Gretel!
- Plant your own beans, seeds or vegetables and see what you can grow at home!

As Authors:

We will be reading and starting to retell the stories of Goldilocks and the Three Bears, The Three Little Pigs, Jack and the Beanstalk and Little Red Riding Hood.

As Explorers:

We will be learning more about the world around us, making connections with our experiences and sharing our thoughts, feelings and ideas with our friends.

As Creators:

We will be experimenting more with 3D modelling and construction. We will be creating dens and outdoor structures too!
